#### What Kind of Paper Do You Use?

~ ~

The Women's Division and the United Methodist Church advocate for elimination of dioxin, a highly toxic by-product of the chlorine bleaching process used in making paper. The dioxin problem applies to paper we use at home: toilet paper, napkins, feminine hygiene products, paper towels, etc., and that we use commercially like copying paper. Here are some do's and don'ts on using chlorine-free paper:

DO read labels carefully. DO look for unbleached paper. If hydrogen peroxide is used, that's okay. DON'T buy elementally chlorinefree paper. The bleaching process still produces dioxin and organochlorines.

There are two types of chlorine-free paper: TCF-totally chlorine free and PCF-processed chlorine-free. TCF uses virgin pulp not produced with chlorine compounds or bleaching agents. PCF is 100% recycled paper not re-processed with the offending chemicals and compounds. Both kinds of papers have been selected out of our concern for the health of people and our planet.
