PLANTING YOUR EASTER HYDRANGEAS



Gradually acclimate the plant to the outdoors. When fully accustomed to the outside, dig the hole twice as wide and as deep as the root ball. Planting in an eastern or southern exposure with morning sun and protection from the wind is best. Water well and keep moist through the summer growing season.
