#### **Pastor's Ponderings**

"In order to form a more perfect union, establish justice, insure domestic tranquility, provide for the common defense, promote the general welfare, and secure the blessings of liberty to ourselves and our posterity" (from the Preamble to the US Constitution)...

The SE Memphis Cooperative Parish Council met Monday, July 20, 2015. Representatives from Aldersgate, Asbury, and El Redentor Churches were present. There was fairly open and honest communication among the representatives; and all in all, it seemed to be a productive meeting.

A summation of the meeting will be provided to you soon, but for now I'll offer my initial observations:

- There are more positive aspects to living in this relationship than there are negative.
- The general consensus is that we can be stronger, and we can reach deeper into the community by working together than any of us can individually. Most specifically, the relationship enables us to be multicultural in our efforts to reach the community for Christ in ways that none of us could individually.

Certainly there are areas for improvement, and know that we'll be working consistently to make those needed improvements. This note and the summation that will soon follow is a first attempt to improve communication about the work of the Parish Council among the congregations.

Clearly, there is a general lack of understanding about what it means to be partners in ministry with other congregations. One of the best definitions I've found for Cooperative Ministry is this:

It is "a style of ministry that helps us focus both on the health and strength of the local congregation and on witness and outreach across a larger geographical area".

These are some of the ways Cooperative Ministry can be beneficial:

- It can enhance and build up the identity and strength of local congregations
- It can affirm the value of all congregations
- It can help move beyond maintenance to strong ministries of witness and outreach in our communities.

It is a way of doing ministry that goes to the heart of what United Methodist connectionalism is all about. (Cooperative Ministry, A. Clay Smith)

So bear with us, as we continue to struggle to understand and grow into what it means to live in Christian community together called a "parish". Pray for us as we seek God's guidance and wisdom. While we don't guite know what it means to live and serve together, we know that none of us can do individually what we hope to do together. We believe that cooperative ministry is the best alternative for our three churches.



## TENNESSEE TAX FREE WEEKEND IS AUGUST 7-9

Mark your calendars and set your reminders for Tennessee's Tax Free Holidays! A lot of money could be saved during this weekend on back-to-school items and home computers.

From 12:01 a.m. on Friday, August 7, through 11:59 p.m. on Sunday, August 9, you will be able to purchase certain items tax free. In Tennessee, the items are:

Clothing under \$100 per item School and school art supplies under \$100 per item Computers (for personal use) under \$1500 each

The exemption not only applies to store-bought items, but also to purchases by phone, internet, or mail order in which the retailer accepts the order during the tax free period.
