#### **GRACE PLACE MADE IT TO THE BIG TIME!**

The current edition of the Memphis Conference News carries a story about the anniversary celebration of the prison-based congregation, Grace Place UMC. "Journey of Grace" was the theme for the event celebrating 10 years as a Methodist church and 5 years as a chartered United Methodist congregation. Now housed near Fort Pillow, TN, Grace Place began life at the Mark Luttrell Corrections Center in Memphis.

Bessie Dodd, a former inmate, a Grace Place member, and the keynote speaker at the celebration, spoke about what Grace Place meant to her while incarcerated and after she was released. Calling it her 'home', she said it had transformed her life. Even though she was physically in prison, her new-found faith provided her a different kind of freedom.

Some of our Aldersgate members and supporters of Grace Place, Diana Bedwell, Lynn Coffman, Rebeca Ernst, Perri Mathis and Lana Solomon celebrated the event with Dr. Virginia and Jay at First UMC in Covington, TN. Dr. Virginia, a close friend of Grace Places's pastor, Rev. Diane Harrison, remarked that the church's birth and growth within the walls of a prison couldn't be done, but for God. Mary Mortenson, executive director of Prison Congregations of America, stated, "As long as there are prisoners, our work will continue. Grace Place is what a healthy prison congregation should look like. It has touched people on both sides of the razor wire".

We must have a count early so please sign up by Sept. 7th.



**Follow Your Gift**

When I was a new Christian, one of the popular songs we listened to was David Meece's "Count the Cost." The song talked about how you need to give your whole heart to the Lord and serve: the focus was intense.

Over the years I joined churches which intensified the focus even more. You had to be in ministry all the time. If you spoke to someone with a ministry of prayer, you had to be a prayer warrior. If you were around people with a music ministry, they thought you were lax if you didn't slip in and out of praise and worship all day. The Bible scholars were on you to study, study!

It took me a few years to work out that those who had a passion for their gift, sometimes couldn't see past it: thus pressure was passed on to others to use the gift the same way. I understand. I get passionate about my gifts too and don't know how others can possibly function without them.

However, the trap for me was when the pressure to always be in ministry became guilt, when God had me taking time out. Sometimes I have had seasons away from God's work. I always felt condemned when that happened. I thought I was a fat, spiritually lazy, gospel blogger.

Then a fellow blogger put this message on her blog and it spoke to me: "God doesn't want something from us, He simply wants us." That was not the way I had been brought up to think in church... but it did make sense from the Biblical perspective God was slowly teaching me. "Spiritual peer pressure" to perform had to be put into perspective. The Bible often refers to seasons. There is a time to rest; a time to work. I had to work with His plan at any given time.

So if you don't fit other's gifts, or have a formal ministry, don't fret about it. If God has a ministry vision for your future, one will come along in His own good time. We have strength and bread for this day and that's what we always need to work on: what He is teaching us now as we focus on simply just being with Him.
