THE WRITE REVEREND



Yesterday, I had the opportunity to participate in a panel discussion that looked at some of the challenges facing us denominationally as we approach General Conference in 2016. The discussion was sponsored by Black Methodists for Church Renewal (BMCR) and looked at the issues from an African American perspective, but, as we all know, issues like this are much larger than any one ethnic group.

For many people schism seems inevitable. They see no resolution to the question of how we as a denomination deal with issues associated with fully including our Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgendered and Questioning (LGBTQ) brothers and sisters. Some United Methodists argue that our Social Principles are right in saying that homosexuality is not compatible with Christian principles: "The United Methodist Church does not

condone the practice of homosexuality and considers this practice incompatible with Christian teaching." Other United Methodists want to change our language and our stance and fully include LGBTQ people in our communities of faith, recognizing and performing marriages with same sex couples and ordaining persons who are members of this community. Still others propose to let annual conferences and local churches make decisions about these issues based on their unique perspectives so as to avoid schism and to accommodate ourselves to the culture in which we live.

These are indeed difficult questions and will require much prayer and hard work to find resolution. I would like to ask you to keep the United Methodist Church in your prayers as we head toward General Conference and the challenges before us. Let me know where you think we're headed and what you think we should do.

OBSERVING LENT







Lent (Quadragesima in Latin) is a solemn religious observance, beginning on Ash Wednesday and ending at dusk on Holy Saturday, the last day of Holy Week. The Easter vigil is then begun, marking the official start of the Easter season.

Lent is the season of the Christian year when the pious focus on simple living, prayer and fasting in order to grow closer to God. In many traditions, the customs of penance, almsgiving and self-denial are practiced.

In more recent times, the idea of 'taking' up something, rather than 'giving' up something, has become popular.

Here are a few suggestions for what to "give up" or "take up" for Lent:

Give up the snooze button on your alarm.

Get to know your neighbors better.

Give up eating meat on Fridays.

Give away something every day, be it time, money, or possessions.

Turn off the lights when you leave a room but let your light shine.

Leave a post-it note with a positive message wherever you go.

Make a list of 40 people who have touched your life. Write to one each day.

Volunteer at a soup kitchen.

Stop using the word "can't".

Say the Lord's Prayer before you get out of bed in the morning and when you get into bed at night.

Smile at everyone you see.

Find a different thing in God's creation to appreciate and be thankful for every day and praise Him.

Add your own ideas to our list. Some things are harder than you think. Have you ever thought about giving up your fork and spoon and learning to eat with chopsticks? Our Oriental friends can do the opposite.
