



If being a Methodist was easy, anybody could be one. Especially challenging is our itinerate system of clergy deployment. Each year, after consultation with local church Staff Parish Relations Committees and Pastors, our Bishop and his cabinet, made up of all the District Superintendents, meet to project who will serve the needs of the kingdom in what place best and for how long.

Its not an easy job, especially when it seems that the needs of the Annual Conference often appear to trump the needs of any local church and the people in the pews are left thinking and feeling that they don't really matter; their needs have not been heard or considered; their church, in the grand scheme of things, does not matter. But believe me, that is not the case. Preachers also often have those same feelings and frustrations with our system. What we sometimes do not remember, however, is that God's

spirit is actively engaged with this process and even when it seems that we, as individuals or congregations, have been forgotten and abandoned and ignored, God is working to bring about God.

In Romans, the 12th chapter, verse 2, the Apostle Paul writes: "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect".

The Greek word translated *transformed* is metamorpoo, from which we get our word metamorphosis. It describes the process through which caterpillars are transformed into beautiful butterflies. One crucial stage in this process is the struggle to leave the cocoon. The newly formed butterfly makes a small whole in the bottom of the cocoon and forces itself through that tight little opening. It's the pressure of getting through that opening that forces fluids in other parts of the body into the butterfly's wings that gives them the strength and form necessary for flight. Without the struggle to escape the cocoon, the butterfly would never fly and would eventually die, never having reached its potential.

The same can be said for us as citizens of the kingdom and collectively in local churches; our present struggles prepare us for the future glory God has for us. The challenge is to complete our work in the cocoon, break out, and try our wings.



UMW NEWS Micro-loans Start Businesses and Improve Lives in Cote d'Ivoire

Just one of the many ways the UMW's money to missions changes the world for the better is making 'micro-loans' to women in the Cote d'Ivoire Conference. Dorcas Adou, president of the United Methodist Women in the Abidjan District in this Conference, was praying for a way to help the many women and children living in poverty on the Ivory Coast. She approached the international UMW office in New York and was given \$20,000 to make micro loans to help women set up and run enterprises that would feed their families, keep their children in school, teach them good business practices and change their lives. 48 women have used these loans to start their own businesses.

Though they work long hours, up to 14 hours a day, for what we would call a pittance, perhaps \$10 to \$40 a week, these women feel truly blessed to have these business opportunities that they learned of in their local Methodist churches.

From tailoring, to juice making, to pressing palm oil and beyond, the lives of these women and their families have been greatly improved, all to the glory of God, with a small investment by United Methodist Women.
