
FISH FRY AND WALK-A-THON FUNDRAISER FOR LAKESHORE CAMP

Have you heard of InterServ?

In the early 1900's it was called Wesley House, followed by Wesley Community House, followed by Wesley Community Center. In 1971 it became Wesley/Catholic Services; in 1974 it was renamed to Wesley/Catholic/Presbyterian Services. The United Church of Christ was also a sponsor but adding them to the name would have been very unwieldy. Finally, in 1975 the agency took on the much more manageable name: InterServ.


Opened by the Women's Home Missionary Society, a predecessor of today's United Methodist Women, the agency offered daycare for a nickel a day, sewing, cooking and housekeeping classes, basketry, whittling, game nights and Bible classes, as well as a 6 week VBS every summer. A relief store was opened and a milk station provided milk to poor families.

Today, InterServ continues the ministries started by Methodist Women more than a century ago, seeking to serve those left most vulnerable by today's economy. (Excerpts from Response magazine)
