

The General Conference chose to stand united for the sake of staying in mission, requesting leader ship from the Council of Bishops. Because of this request, any changes in our position on human sexuality were postponed. No changes in the Book of Discipline have been made.

We celebrated our success with the Imagine No Malaria campaign in raising \$68.5 million so far.
We continued our Acts of Repentance with a presentation from the Cheyenne and Arapaho tribes about the Methodist involvement in 1864 Sand Creek massacre.
