THE WRITE REVEREND



“But he’s already made it plain how to live, what to do, what GOD is looking for in men and women. It’s quite simple: Do what is fair and just to your neighbor, be compassionate and loyal in your love, and don’t take yourself too seriously— take God seriously.” Micah 6:8 The Message (MSG)

As I got ready for work Monday morning, the news announced that a grand jury decision on whether to issue and indictment of the police officer who shot and killed Michael Brown in Ferguson, Mo. recently might be forthcoming. While our Pledge of Allegiance claims we are “one nation, under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all,” the racial and social and economic and gender and class divides among us say otherwise. But, thanks be to God, we don’t have these problems in the church! In the words of a familiar hymn, “we are one in the spirit, we are one in the Lord, and they know we are Christians by our love.” In the church, we know how to treat each other, and how to respect each other, and how to be open and honest with each other regardless of race or class or gender or economic status; that is, if this was a perfect world. We all also know, however, that ours is not a perfect world; not even in church. In the church, like in so many other places, we struggle to be all that God calls us to be, and to do all that we are called to do. The difference is that in the Church, we have the spirit of God who calls us to be our higher and better selves often in spite of ourselves. Take our worship last Sunday as an example. While the service progressed in English, one Spanish-speaking family heard our worship in their own language as Pastor Goyo de la Cruz served as translator. Barry Pilkinton has been gathering parts and pieces and putting together a wireless system for translation that works side by side with our hearing assistance system to meet the needs of our diverse congregation. On next Sunday, we will baptize infant Sofia Hernandez, and her father into our faith and accept that family into our church, with a welcoming reception for all our new members to follow. Will it change the world? Yes it will! It will bring our world just a little bit closer to what God wants our world to be.
